Language Area

The Chinese sounds will be 丁里彳 and 孑and 部首 (stroke). In the English classroom, the sounds are Rr, Yy, Mm and Qq. The children will work with object and word matching. They will do blue reading with picture and word matching. We will also play bingo. The Chinese poem is 山居秋瞑 (Shan Ju Qiu Ming). The English poem is "Five Little Reindeer."

This month we will focus on how to use measuring spoons, including teaspoons and tablespoons. Students will also work with sewing, chop-sticks work, and washing dishes.

Math Area

The children will continue to learn more about the numbers they are working with and learn the concepts of more and less. For the older children, we will be teaching carrying over (dynamics) and counting by 5 and 10. Younger children will work on sandpaper numbers, red rods and Decimal system, 1-99.

Sensorial Area

This month we will work on brown stair, pink tower and long red rods. Brown stair and pink tower help the children learn the consequence of disorder and helps skill through observation, to improve coordination and problem solving. Red rods teach children about height and width.
